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McDOWELL, WILLIAM GEORGE Papers, 1906 - 1938

Background:

William George McDowell served as the fifth Episcopal Bishop pf Alabama. Born August 2, 1882 in Lexington, Kentucky, McDowell was a graduate of Washington and Lee University and Virginia Theological Seminary. He served as rector of two parishes in Virginia and rector of Church of the Holy Innocents in Auburn, Alabama before being elected Bishop-Coadjutor in 1922. McDowell became Bishop of the diocese in 1928. He died March 20, 1938 in Mobile.

Scope and Content:

The William George McDowell Papers include correspondence relating to McDowell's service as Episcopal Bishop of Alabama, a journal kept by McDowell for the years 1909-1918, photographs, newspaper clippings and a scrapbook of clippings about McDowell's life and career.
